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



ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

The ubuquitous Colonial Cape cottage with all the basic characteristics of a 1807 farmstead. The feature architectural details are small molding on the front (south) facade and extended lintels. The windows are 2 over 2. The roof ridge and slope as well as soffit are unstable. The brick chimney is tall and narrow and corbelled at the top.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Known as the Ichaboo Bosworth farm, according to the 1853 walling map. There were at least 3 outbuildings already built before 1890. This farm sits east of the Regoboth line and bordered on the Chase Families land on the other 3 sides.
