ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This Italianate house has the basic characteristics of the 3-bay, 2-story, small central chimney, side bay and fixed square windows on the side facade. The unusual feature is the floor length windows on the 1st level with 2 over 2 over 2. There are side lights flanking the front door and extended lintels over door and windows. There was possibly a porch at one time.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

The house is listed as belonging to a Irving F. Wood on the Swansea town 1895 map, with one out building situated north of the home, and previous to that, according to the 1853 walling map, land owned by the S. Gardner family.
