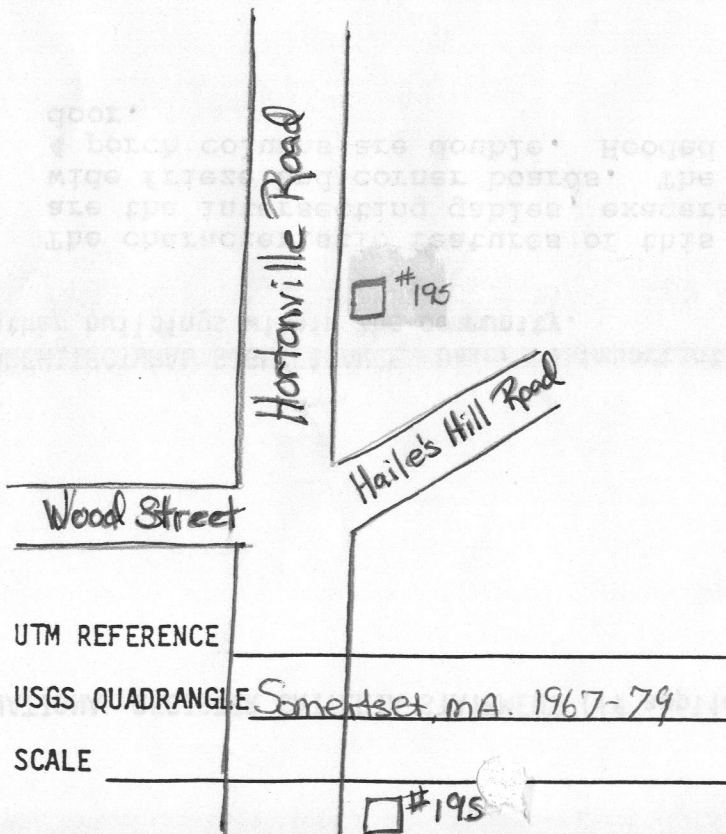

**ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE** Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

The characteristic features of this 1½ - story, 3-bay Italianate cottage are the intersecting gables, exaggerated returns, double rear-drop brackets, wide frieze and corner boards. The windows have 2 over 2 lights and the 4 porch columns are double. Hooded entablature over windows, double entry door.
