

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This early Federal of the 18th century is 5-bay wide with a central chimney. Top floor windows are placed snuggly below the cornice line and possess 9 over 9 lighted windows, while the lower floor windows are 6 over 6. The door is delicate of non- architectonic embellishments. The overall surface is shallow of projections.


