Italianate farmhouse with a 1-story bay window on the north side. The intersecting gables have a wide overhang with no other architectural detail. The windows are 1 over 1 lights. The door is set back with a covered entry porch mounting it.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

This Buffington family decended from Thomas Bovanton who emigrated from Wales about 1671 and settled first in Salem, MA., then came to Swansea. They were members of Swansea Monthly Meeting Friends Society.
