ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

One of the four "corner" houses in Swansea Center or Luther's Corner that is basically an intact example of a Federal Colonial. Built in 1811, the characteristic features include the 2½ - story, 5 - bay symmetrical facade and central chimney. The outstanding details are the gable - end eave overhang, the semi-circular fanlight with decorative pillasters in the door surround, and the splayes window lintels. It has been said that the interior contains six fireplaces.

Proses To Currage

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Luther's Corner or Swansea Center was the 19th century focal point of the community. Important transportation routes between R.I. and North Swansea and Mt. Hope Bay and Fall River passed through this center. John Brown Luther is the first known owner of this structure and owned it for five years before his death and Joseph G. Luther succeeded him. Joseph G. Luther was a successful merchant and owned the store that was built diagonally across from his home. He was also prominent in town affairs and served as town clerk, treasurer and tax collector. He was well thought of in the community. There are over 30 Luthers listed in the 1790 census as "Heads of Families in Swansea."
