ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

One of many early 19th century Cape style colonial cottages in Swansea. Characteristic features are the l^{1}_{2} - story, 5-bay facade with an offset chimney. The windows are two over one-probably changed in the late 19th century from 6 over 6, which is still on the second floor. The short hood over the front door was added for practicality at a much later date.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Originally the Swansea Union Manufacturing Company of textile goods, the now Swan Finishing Company; and most of its buildings have been added on throughout the years. Sited on the town map of 1896 as the Swansea Dye Works.
