ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

Simple Georgian half-house with off-set shimney to right. Added ell to back. This home features details of fluted pilasters at door, surrounded by a pedimented portico with supporting collumnetts. All windows are 6 over 6 lights.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

This was the home built for Captain Joseph Northam who settled in Swansea Village after the Revolutionary War when trade once more became profitable. His was one of several on the street built at that time. It was occupied by family members until 1916.


