

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

Smaller than most shingle style commerceal buildings, typically of those in near by Newport, R.I., this house offers three open bays on its facade and full front p orch. Roof pitch is high and gable ears have large returns. Porch supports are plain.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Although this two story hall and meeting place was erected for the use of the Dorothy Brown Rebekah Lodge, it was used for many years as a community center for varied activities. Public clambakes were served to as many as a thousand people in the surrounding grove. Community groups and church organizations scheduled meetings and public suppers there. In the summer lawn parties with outdoor dancing took place on the lighted grounds. Groups from other towns often hired the hall and grounds for picnics.

Since 1970 Ledgeview Children's Service Center has operated a day care center for young children there. The situation is ideal for such an undertaking.

The lodge is named for Dorothy Brown wife of John Brown one of the founders of the town of Swansea. Several of her descendants have been members.


